

# **AF JROTC STANDARDS**

#### Male Hair Standards:

- Will be <u>clean, well-groomed, present a professional</u> <u>appearance</u>, allow proper wear of headgear. Will not appear lopsided, touch either eyebrow, or end below an imaginary line across the forehead at the top of the eyebrows that is parallel to the ground.
- Hair will have a <u>tapered appearance on both sides and the</u> <u>back of the head, both with and without headgear</u>.



# **AF JROTC STANDARDS**

#### Male Hair Standards (con't):

- Hair will **not exceed 2 ½ inches in bulk**, regardless of length and ¼ inch at natural termination point; allowing only closely cut or shaved hair on the back of the neck to touch the collar.
- Hair will not protrude under the front band of headgear.
- Cadets may have one (cut, clipped or shaved) front to back, straight-line part, not slanted or curved, on either side of their head, above the temple. Part will not exceed 4 inches length or ¼ inch width. <u>Men are not authorized hair extensions.</u>

# **AF JROTC STANDARDS**

#### Female Hair Standards :

- Will be <u>clean, well-groomed, present a professional</u> <u>appearance</u>, allow proper wear of headgear. Will not appear lopsided, touch either eyebrow, or end below an imaginary line across the forehead at the top of the eyebrows that is parallel to the ground.
- If applied, dyes, tints, bleaches and frostings must result in natural hair colors. <u>Examples</u> of <u>natural hair colors</u> are brown, blonde, brunette, natural red or black. \*refer to handbook for clarification\*



# **AF JROTC STANDARDS**

#### Female Hair Standards (con't):

- No minimum hair length, to a **maximum bulk of 4 inches** from scalp and allows proper wear of headgear.
- Bangs, or side-swiped hair, may touch eyebrows but will not touch or cover eyes. When in doubt, assess correct length of hair with the cadet standing in the position of attention.
- Locs, braids, twists, micro-braids, French braids, Dutch braids and cornrows are authorized. If adding additional hair, it must be a natural-looking color. \*refer to handbook for clarification\*

### **AF JROTC STANDARDS**

#### Fingernails:

- If worn by females, nail polish will be a <u>SINGLE COLOR</u> that does not detract from the uniform, nor can the nail polish be extreme in color. Some examples of extreme colors include, but are not limited to, purple, gold, blue, black, bright (fire engine) red, florescent colors, and WHITE. Do not apply designs to nails or apply two-tone or multi-tone colors; however, white-tip French manicures are authorized. Fingernails <u>must not exceed ¼</u> inch in length beyond the tip of the finger and must be clean and well groomed. Fingernails must not hinder proper fit of prescribed safety equipment or uniform items.
- Male cadets are not authorized to wear nail polish.



# **AF JROTC STANDARDS**


#### **Body Piercings:**

- **NOT** allowed to attach or display objects, articles, jewelry or ornamentation to or through the ear, nose, tongue, or any exposed body part (including anything that might be visible through the uniform).
- *Female* cadets in uniform, however, are allowed to wear conservative earrings, pierced or clip in style, in their earlobes.
- Male cadets will not wear earrings in uniform.
